E. Public Works Superintendent, Ryan Flannery

1. Projects completed/working on since the last Council meeting

- a. Sprayed lagoons and pasture with sterilant.
- b. Fixed pot hole on Bruneau behind family dollar. Council asked to Fix holes at Pour House.
- c. Weekly waste water samples.
- d. Sprayed some of the right of ways around town with sterilant.
- e. Put in sewer enzymes.
- f. Dug drain hole on 3rd Ave in front of feed store.
- g. Graded 3rd Ave drains and jetted the irrigation line to drain.
- h. Burned the leaves in the ditch in city park.
- i. Mowed up leaf's city park.
- j. Cleaned water and waste water buildings.
- k. Replaced irrigation plumbing inside island park pump house to galvanized pipe.
- l. Flushed Wye St., Morning Dove, Kent St., and Simpkin Lane
- m. Fixed swing in city park.
- n. Repaired main service line in front of 410 Main.

- b. Repair irrigation line on corner of 1st St and 3rd Ave.
- c. Replace irrigation line on corner of 1st St and Butte.
- d. Repair irrigation line in city park.
- e. Repair embankment along drain ditch that runs through city park.
- f. Trim tree limbs on knob In towards canal B.
- g. Fill in pot holes on knob In towards canal B.
- h. Fix all potholes in all alley ways.
- i. Having Campbell Tractors look at John Deere tractor due to excessive blowby in the motor. Council asks for Bid on taking the Tracter.
- j. Team training meeting in PW shop each Tuesday.
- k. Working with Kirby on moving irrigation line that runs down 1st Ave due to it being in the path of the new road and sidewalk.
- l. Working with Kirby on chipseal plan. Kirby keeps track and bring a list to council road plan made.
